Randy was a pioneer in the bond counsel practice in Mississippi, helping Watkins Ludlam Winter & Stennis, P.A. become the first firm in Mississippi to qualify as nationally recognized bond counsel. After graduating from Harvard Law School and serving for two years in the United States Army, Randy joined this firm in 1970 and was instrumental in developing the public finance practice for the law firm.

During his career, Randy has been involved in the development of the law and practice regarding finance for municipalities, counties, school districts, universities, community colleges, utility districts, and special use districts, and has served as bond counsel, issuer's counsel and developer's counsel regarding many types of economic development projects.

Randy is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin (B.A., 1965) and Harvard Law School (J.D., 1968). He is a frequent speaker on the topic of public finance for various industry associations in the Mississippi Municipal League conferences and associations for attorneys representing governmental entities. He is also co-author of the chapter: Borrowing and Debt Administration in A Handbook for City Officials which is published by the Mississippi Municipal League and co-author of the chapter: Borrowing and Debt Administration in the Handbook for County Officials published by Mississippi State University Extension Services.
